

Regulation photo contest

Organized by CCSTI Grenoble in the context of European project Nanoyou
Project financed by the 7th framework programme of the European Commission
(FP7/2007-2013), under grant agreement 233433

Inscription modalities

- Inscription can only be done on-line (www.nanoyou.eu) from December 7th 2009 and during the entire contest till July 1st 2010, 12h00.
- The participants need to register on the website in order to obtain a user account. The account information is subjected to the right to access and rectify under conditions provided for by the information privacy law. With exception of age, type and domain of activities of participants, this information is confidential and is exclusively used for the organisation of the contest. The information will not be used by individuals or commercial organisations. Each participant will be able to choose whether his/her photos will be published using his/her real name or pseudonym.
- The contest is open to all persons aged between 16 and 25.

Organisation of the contest

- In order to participate, participants need to have a user account. See also *inscription modalities*.
- The theme of the photo contest is: 'my intelligent environment'. What does an intelligent environment look like? What does it bring you and what does it take away from you?
- Publication of a photo will take place in two steps: firstly the photo is documented by its photographer by filling out a dedicated form on the NANOYOU website. Then the photo will be transferred to the server. See also *restrictions*.
- The contest will be closed at July 1st 2010, 12h00.
- The jury will publish its decision on www.nanoyou.eu on July 7th 2010 and will inform the winners directly by email. See also *designation of winners*.

Restrictions

- No limitation on style or de genre will be imposed to participants, however photos may not damage the image of persons, trademarks etc. See also *author rights*.
- Minimum resolution of video: 300 dpi and minimal format: 10x15 cm.
- Accepted file formats: .tif, .jpg

Designation of winners

- The selection of the 3 best photos and their commentaries will be done by a jury.
- Competitors will be classified by:
 - The relevance with which the theme is addressed, the originality and the lucidity of the mise-en-scène of the intelligent environments
 - The consideration of scientific and technological trends
 - The consideration of ethical, social and legal risks and opportunities associated with the use of intelligent environments and which influence daily life directly
 - Artistic and creative quality

Prize

- First, second and third prize: A prize of 500 €, 250 € et 150 € will be given to the photographers who respectively realized the best, second best and third best photo according to the jury's judgement (see also *designation of winners*)
- The winning photos, as well as any other participating photo which is judged appropriate by CCSTI Grenoble, will be integrated in the exhibition 'DIY future', which will be open from October 2010 at *Casemate* (Grenoble) and which will travel through France and Europe afterwards.
- In case CCSTI Grenoble is not capable to organize one or more of the announced prizes, she reserves the right to replace the prize with an equivalent of the same value, without this giving rise to any claim.

Intellectual property and author rights

- Photos created in the context of this photo contest are subject to the French law governing copyright. All materials used to create the photos and their commentaries must therefore be free of copyright related to reproduction and distribution.
- With participation in this photo contest participants grant CCSTI Grenoble to the right of reproduction and distribution of their creations on any communication medium.

Claims

- Participation implies full agreement of the competitors on the acceptance of this regulation.
- The mere fact of participation implies acceptance of any decision that CCSTI Grenoble might make with regard to problems which might not be covered by this regulation.
- CCSTI Grenoble can not be held responsible for changes in dates, alteration or even cancelling of the contest altogether, following an insufficient number of participants, event of major force or any cause beyond its control.
